#### HOW WE PIVOTED DURING THE PANDEMIC



When COVID-19 became present in our region in March 2020, we put the health and safety of our community first. We moved a majority of hearings into a virtual setting and allowed staff to work remotely when able.

In spring of 2021, as COVID-19 restrictions were lifted statewide, all staff were back on-site and most hearings and specialized docket sessions were in-person.




#### **PEACE OF MIND**

Civil War Veteran in Summit County.





#### Receipts and Disbursements 2016-2020 Data








Case Filings and Dispostions


